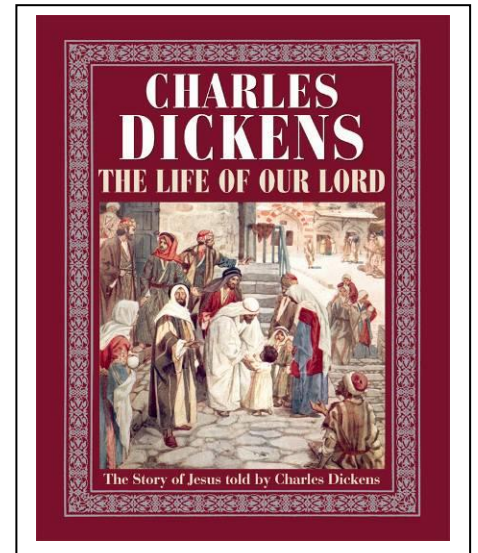

one of the masters of literature but has nevertheless maintained all the magic and accuracy of the Gospels themselves. Specifically in his will he forbade the publication of the manuscript until such time as all his children had died. His grandchildren, but not unanimously, did agree to publish and the manuscript was sold to Associated Newspapers (Daily Mail in London) for an incredible £40,000 and was also syndicated to newspapers overseas. The "San Francisco News" published it in serial form starting March 5<sup>th</sup> 1934. Associated Newspapers then produced *Life of Our Lord* in book form to sell to its readers. Remarkably there have been very few editions since. Some have been included in later complete works and there have been some fairly nondescript editions about 30 years ago. This edition however is a true facsimile and even the spelling mistakes, with appropriate editorial notes, are included. There is a colour illustration at every opening depicting a scene from the text opposite. The illustrations themselves, all in colour, are a very much to the period of Dickens's writing and thus totally complement the text.
